3.1	Aileen Mundy was welcomed as a new member and representative of the Guide movement in Lenzie.	
<b>4.0</b>	<b>POLICE REPORT</b>	
	PC Gerard Canning attended and reported on the period since the December meeting of LCC. The new parking restrictions are coming into force as yellow lines are painted and associated plates mounted. Parking issues may have been exacerbated by the road closures in the period and it was noted that there were instances of inconsiderate parking across driveways. However it was often difficult to show that an offence had been committed in these instances. Operation Skipjack, concerned with doorstep crime was discussed and it was noted that PCs Standby and Ramsay were concerned with that in this area. <b>5.0</b>	<b>EMERGING LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN</b>	
	Stewart McNally, EDC Planning Policy, attended for this item. He noted that several proposals for housing in LDP2 had been carried forward and in some cases were now being built. Others may yet be reconsidered, for example the Meadowburn Avenue proposal. It was noted that S46 Boghead Road and S201 Crosshill Road had an unchanged status (not suitable for residential development) and S366 Campsie View is a new proposal consequent on the closure of Campsie View School. The only major area in Lenzie which might now be considered for residential development is Kirkintilloch Gateway comprising S346, S347, S24, S100 and S364. This is a complex area, currently designated for business and mixed use and would need considerable work done before it could be offered for use. Sheltered housing, some residential use and in S100, 2,000 sqm of retail space might be considered. There was discussion of 'infrastructure', eg more and more housing being placed at an excessive distance from access to public transport. Stewart encouraged us to participate in one or other consultations related to the National Planning Framework, as this is the point where policy is formulated. There is a consultation meeting in Glasgow on 17 <sup>th</sup> March. Mr McNally was thanked for his input and it was agreed that there might be a follow up meeting.

11.1	There had been a rash of complaints recently concerning issues that are thought to be the responsibility of EDC Roads Department. Pot holes and road surfaces generally were at the top of the list, but other issues such as diversion signage and pedestrian footways have been raised. It was agreed to invite Thomas McMenamin of EDC to the next meeting of LCC. He also has responsibility for Streetscene and Greenspace matters. <b>12.0</b>	<b>GALA 2020</b>	
12.1	<b>Gala 2020</b> - A Facebook campaign to try to get more volunteers had been mounted by LJ and PK, so far without much reaction. The financial situation at present makes it unlikely that the Gala could be run in the same manner as recent years, due to the cost of hiring tentage and staging. Previous business sponsors had been approached and seemed willing to participate. A new sponsor has offered help and to run a Fundraising event. However, a new suggestion was made to run the Gala	<b>ALL</b>

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	in an entirely different venue. Many details of this alternative had still to be worked out but members were very enthusiastic to explore this and those who had raised the idea were greatly commended for bringing it forward. It was agreed to pursue this alternative.

13.1	<b>Lenzie Hall – Post-meeting note</b> Correspondence had been received from LCDT concerning their bid for lease of the Public Hall. Lack of time in the meeting meant that this could not be reported or discussed, so the question raised is being noted here for the first time. Essentially LCC was being asked if it would resume use of the Hall premises, if they were brought up to a useable standard. The Secretary had replied on behalf of LCC that this of course would most likely be the case.  It is also noted that East Dunbartonshire Council resolved at its meeting on 20 <sup>th</sup> February to allocate £0.5M in its budget to refurbishing Lenzie Hall.
