<b>2.0</b>	<b>MINUTES OF 15<sup>TH</sup> JULY 2020 VIRTUAL MEETING</b>

<b>3.0</b>	<b>MATTERS ARISING</b>	
3.1	<b>Town Centre Recovery project</b> – A list of 14 businesses supported in the first round of PPE supply was received (see separate note attached to email 19/08/2020 from Tony Miles.) Various actions were agreed on further PPE purchase and distribution, digital marketing and signage.	
<b>4.0</b>	<b>PLANNING</b>	
4.1	<b>Weekly lists</b> - The Planning Convener had provided a summary of applications on the weekly lists covering July to August and these did not appear to be contentious.	
4.2	<b>Local Development Plan 2</b> – EDC plan to meet in virtual session on Thursday 20 <sup>th</sup> August to receive LDP2, which runs to over 4,000 pages. A link to the plan had been obtained and the Council meeting will be open to the public via Youtube.	
4.3	<b>Site at Woodilee Road</b> – The Planning Convener has been informed that this application has been withdrawn.	
4.4	<b>Tattoo Parlour</b> – There is a proposal for a Tattoo Parlour (requiring change of use) in one of the vacant shops on Alexandra Avenue.	
<b>5.0</b>	<b>CORRESPONDENCE</b>	
5.1	<b>Kelvin River path</b> - A proposal on behalf of LCDT was received suggesting that a walkway between Torrance and the Allander River could be made. A reply was given that parts of this route are already walkable and the EDC Access Forum has such a route under consideration. The Forum has not met for some time, as the key post of Access Officer has not been filled since retiral of the previous post holder. Enquiries have been made as to the current state of route development and the future of the Access Forum, on which the Secretary represents LCC.	<b>TG</b>
