<b>3.0</b>	<b>MATTERS ARISING</b>	
3.1	<b>Proposed Defibrillator</b> – It was noted that the former taxi office is being fitted out as hairdressing business and Mark Billington agreed to raise the Defibrillator plan with the people involved. Contact had also been made with Scotrail, the suggestion being that the equipment could be mounted externally at the north platform waiting room. However the contact persons in Scotrail had changed twice and there had been no further response. It was agreed that further contact should be pursued.	<b>MB &amp; TG</b>
3.2	<b>LCDT update</b> – On the Kelvin River path, there has been no response from EDC on the matters raised re plans for such a path or regarding the future of the Access Forum. Since the last meeting, LCDT had issued a Newsletter and it was agreed that this be circulated to members, as it contained information on the Kelvin River Path, a 'One Lenzie' civic society and a '20 minute neighbourhood concept.	<b>TG</b>
<b>4.0</b>	<b>PLANNING</b>	
4.1	<b>Weekly lists</b> - The Planning Convener had provided a summary of applications on the weekly lists covering August to September and these did not appear to be contentious.	
4.2	<b>Local Development Plan 2</b> – The online session of EDC on Thursday 20 <sup>th</sup> August had been observed. It was noted that 9 of the sites proposed by developers had <i>not</i> been included in the published plan. Some of these are sites that were rejected previously. It is also noted that a hard copy of LDP2 will be sent to each Community Council. There will be hardcopies of FAQ's, a Helpdesk and a telephone help line.	
4.3	<b>Land for Sale</b> – The Secretary had been contacted on behalf of residents on Newton Road who were concerned that a plot of land on the south side of the Cult Burn opposite was being offered for sale with the stated aim of using it for housing development. At the moment the land is designated as 'open space' and it is also boggy and a haven for certain wildlife. This has been raised with EDC for clarification, but no reply has been received so far.	<b>TG</b>
