<b>2.0</b>	<b>PRESENTATION ON BEHALF OF ALDI</b>	
	Representatives from Aldi described their proposal to create a convenience store at the Kirkintilloch Gateway site (off the roundabout on Initiative Road opposite the Deafblind Scotland Centre.) Plans were shared on the Zoom screen (See LCC website) and included an overall view and maps showing walking, cycling, public transport distances/times from various locations to the proposed site. The main points being made in favour were Aldi stores were expanding substantially in Scotland, their store at Auchinairn seemed to be attracting a substantial patronage by Lenzie residents and their proposal to site a store at Bishopbriggs had been turned down by EDC. 	The proposed 'digital village' part of the project had encountered difficulties and it was considered that a way forward might be to post information on the website/FB that funds might be available to Lenzie businesses for schemes that could be seen to increase 'footfall' or the exposure of businesses in the community that might not currently be well recognised. A member undertook to draft a suitable post text/graphic.
