(Post meeting note – the Planning document is a ‘screening opinion’ carried out with less than full information necessary.) It was suggested that the Secretary make contact with a Bishopbriggs CC member to find out what, if anything BCC is doing about the proposal.	TG

<b>7.1</b>	<b>Communication from Waterside CC</b> - Offer from Cordy Lilly to LCC to make a presentation on their project to demolish Waterside Miners Club and build a Community Hub on the site. They have given this presentation to a regular networking meeting at EDVA and it was suggested by Councillors that they should be giving it to Community Councils more generally. Cordelia Lilly is the Secretary of the project. In discussion, we concluded that we needed more members present to make a decision on hosting the presentation and it would probably be better to separate it from a regular monthly meeting. It might also work better at EDVA premises and draw a bigger attendance.	TG
<b>7.2</b>	<b>Electricity Asset Services</b> – Murdoch had been contacted by Gerard Higgins, representing EAS, the company currently upgrading electrical systems in parts of Lenzie. Mr Higgins has realised that Lenzie residents have had to put up with considerable disturbance during the upgrade works and has suggested that EAS might be open to help in some way as yet unspecified.
