5.0	PLANNING	
5.1	Housing development with access via Lindsaybeg Road - Plans have been submitted for this development but not yet validated. Three Pre-Application Consultation events had been provided over 12 weeks and the developers report good engagement of residents. The layout of housing was changed over the Consultation period with the overall number reducing following consideration of flooding, commercial tree removal and other factors. There is potential for footpath connections but some of the land needed for this is outwith the development red zone and will require to be negotiated with EDC.	

5.2	Weekly lists - The Planning Convenor had circulated a summary of Proposals notified during the period since the last meeting . None of these seemed to require a response from LCC.	
5.3	<p>New Lenzie Academy project (response to Proposals) – There was extensive discussion of items, some of which had been raised previously but not resolved.</p> <p>a) The distance between the old and new LA sites is quoted in some papers on a ‘as the crow flies’ basis but it appears to be incorrect.</p> <p>b) Some of the soil samples appear to be in the unsafe region.</p> <p>c) Continued questions on the postcode status of the proposed school. A post code G66 3BS was stated to be the one applied. (post-meeting information - this post code applies to homes in the southern extension of Monkland Avenue.)</p>
